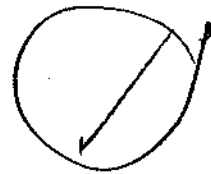

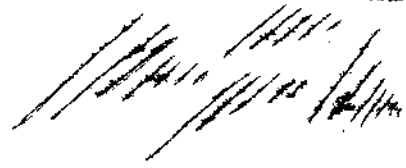
MEDITATION ON GOD IN NATURE

POEM

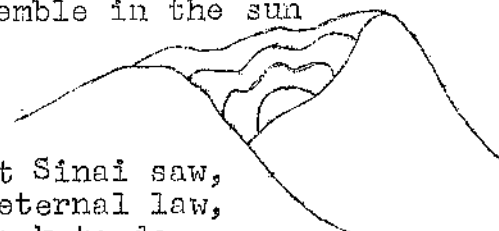
In summer, in the open air

EACH OF US WAS MADE BY GOD

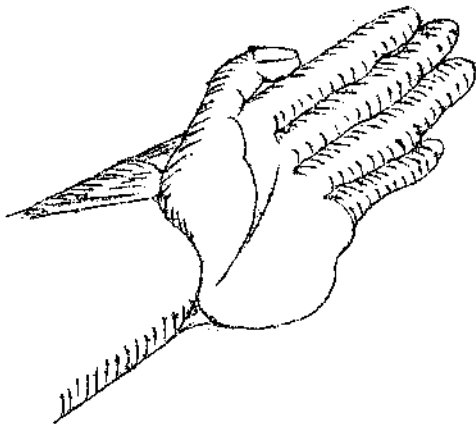

He shall settle all their disputes.

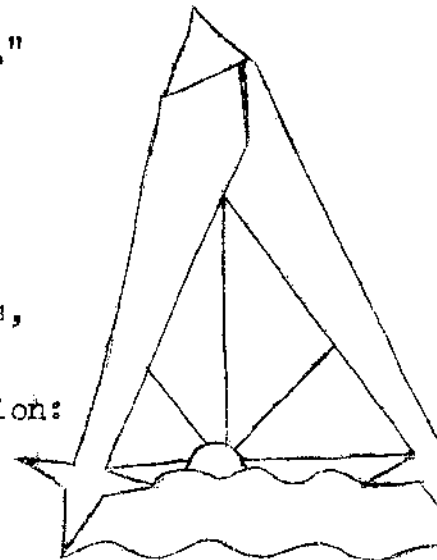
And they shall beat their swords into plowshares,
